Partners for Rural Health in the Dominican Republic (PRHDR) is delighted that you are interested in participating in our Winter Mission 2018!

We look forward to working with you. Our 21 year old organization is unique from other missions of which you may have heard. We are a service learning program.

Participating medical professionals primary role is to provide teaching and mentoring to students. You will be contributing to the foundation of future medical professionals in the setting of primary care.

Dates: The trip will take place from January 3rd to January 15th. Students and faculty will be flying to and from Santiago, DR on these dates. See Group Flight details below.

Trip Fee: The fee for this trip will be \$820. This cost includes: room and board, all ground transportation and evacuation insurance.

Application Process: Letter of Intent: The Letter of Intent (LOI) is the first step in the application process. It is required for new volunteers only. The LOI will help us understand your specific skill set and

qualifications. Please go to the Volunteer page of the website www.prhdr.org and click on Volunteer, "Letter of Intent"

Volunteer Application: Once your LOI has been accepted and we have received 2 letters of recommendation, you will be notified to proceed with the remainder of the forms, found on the Volunteer page.

November 1, 2017, \$100.00 deposit must be received, and will be applied towards the overall trip cost of \$820. ALL PAPER WORK must be received by this date

November 20, 2017, Total amount of \$820 must be paid in full.

Payment Options:

Online Payment: Fees can be paid with your credit card, via Paypal on the PRHDR web site, first page, on the right.

Volunteer Fundraising:

All volunteers are expected to participate in fundraising for the trip, with a goal of \$300 per participant. This funding is essential to helping PRHDR purchase medicines and equipment for the trip. Further information will be sent to you regarding this.

Group Flights:

These are the flights that the students, staff and faculty will be taking. As a volunteer you are responsible for your own travel arrangements. Many volunteers like to book their reservations on the same flights. This is very convenient for all. We highly recommend that you do this. Because the plane out of Portland is small, I would recommend that you book as soon as possible. There are 30 seats being reserved for the Group.

Orientation:

If you live close to Portland or Boston, we require you to attend Orientation which will be Saturday, December 2, 10:00 to 3:00 at USM. This is an important meeting where you will meet members of the team, gain information regarding your role and responsibilities. You will participate in packing medical equipment bags. You will receive more information about the orientation as time draws near. So mark your calendar!!

PRHDR uses Gateway International Plan for trip insurance (www.GatewayPlans.com./ahins/) and this is included in trip fees. This covers Emergency evacuation. Please read the policy carefully for all information

Please email us as soon as possible to let us know that you will be applying for the winter mission

Other Info to Remember:

*Passport is required.

*Vaccines including hepatitis A, typhoid oral or injectable and TB skin test within a year prior to travel.

*Tetanus booster every 10 years, and hepatitis B series of 3 vaccines are recommended since even non-medical persons can be exposed to body fluids. *Occasionally we have a case of traveler's diarrhea.

*Some volunteers will want to take malaria prevention tablets. For more detailed health information for travel to the Dominican Republic please can check the Center for Disease Control web site.

*Dengue, Zika, and Chikungunya have all been reported. We take precautions by liberally applying insect repellent, and use netting on beds.
